

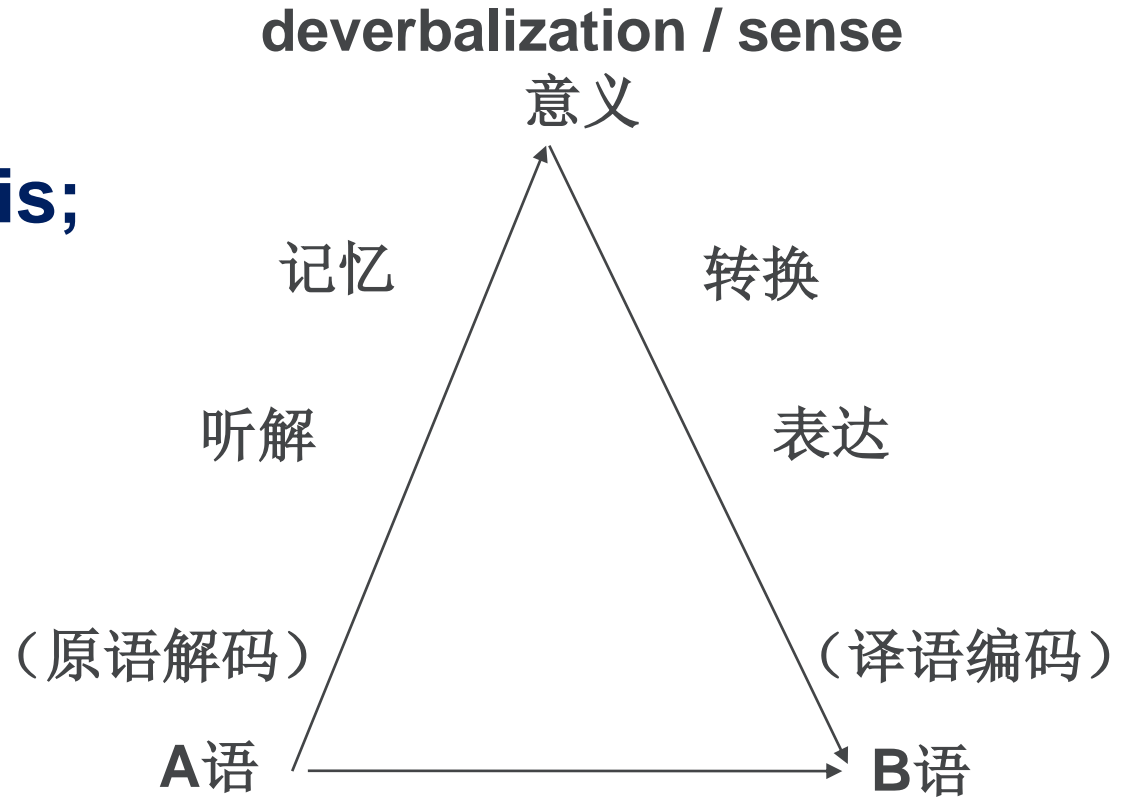

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# Four components of interpreting skills:

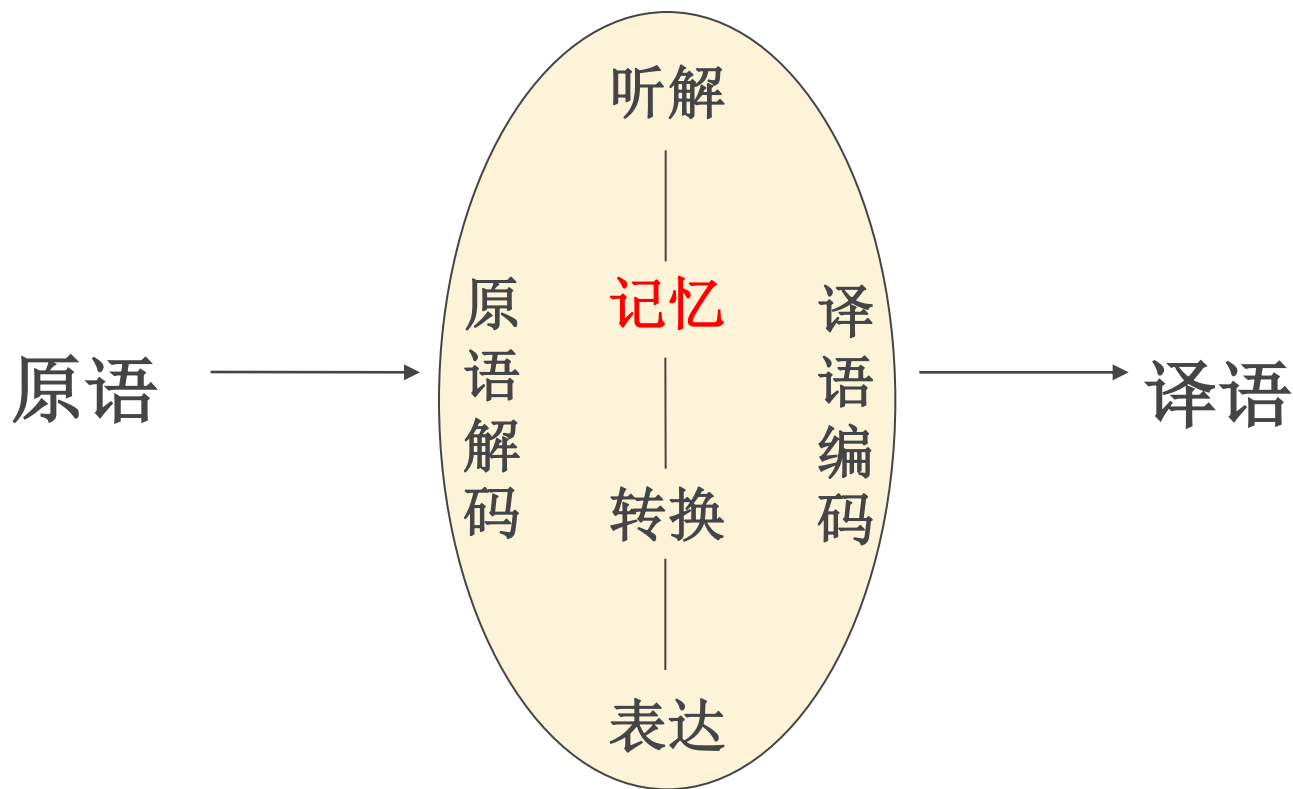
**Listening & Analysis;**

# Note-taking (NT)

- ◆ a crucial skill of consecutive interpreting
- ◆ Conceptual issues of NT
- ✓ **Why take notes?**
- ✓ **What should be taken as notes?**
- ✓ **How to take notes?**

# Why take notes?

- ◆ The length of the source text usually lasting for 3-5 minutes
- ◆ Figures, proper names, listing need exact transcoding (代码转换)
- ◆ Problems with memory: short-term memory fades easily

# Functions of note-taking

- ◆ an aid to supplement memory
- ◆ clues for recalling
- ◆ help to visualize the structure of SL speech
- ◆ help to organize TL reproduction

# What should be taken as notes?

- ◆ Note ideas, not words! (Roazan, 1956)
  - frame of meaning
  - topical words; key words; logical links
- ◆ Note transcoding information!
- ◆ figures, proper names, listing

# How do you take notes?

- ◆ **What:** <selectively> Note ideas, not words!  
topical words; key words; logical links
- ◆ **How:** <briefly> Abbreciation & Symbols  
frequently occurring notions & words
- ◆ **Layout:**  
verticality  
left-hand margin



# Abbreviation & Symbols

- ◆ **The rule of thumb (Roza)**

*Unless a word is short enough (4-5 letters), the interpreter should note it in an abbreviated form.*

- ◆ **e.g.: “member” mem**

**arrows** ↑ ↓ → ←

# Organic symbols

- ◆ One symbol should be used as the root for several related symbols. For example, **there is a system for noting verbs along with their tenses:**

verb terms	<b>go</b>	<b><u>go</u></b>	<b>go↓</b>	<b>↑go</b>
		<b>going</b>	<b>went</b>	<b>will go</b>

# Guidelines for Note-taking:

- Concentrate on meaning/ideas!
- Take notes selectively!
- Using organic symbols!
- Organize notes into some sort of logical form
- Note briefly: ideas → key words → abb. & symbols
- Write legibly. Notes are useless if you cannot read them later!
- If you are not understanding. **STOP** taking notes and **LISTEN!**
